The Rev. Susan Buchanan has served in a variety of ministries connected to the United Methodist Church, from congregational pastor to hospital chaplain to campus minister. She is currently appointed as the Director of Recruitment and Student Services of the Houston-Galveston Extension Program for the Perkins School of Theology at SMU. The Rev. Buchanan believes that as this region is the home of the most active death chamber in the US, people of faith in Texas have a special responsibility to work for the abolition of the death penalty. She became involved in the Texas Coalition to Abolish the Death Penalty several years ago in order to make a greater commitment to advocacy and education on death penalty

Her talk will build on the theme of the TCADP Annual Conference: "Death Penalty Fault Lines: A Seismic Shift in Ground." She will talk about trends, the culture in Texas, and what we can do to help change the culture around the death penalty.

Minister: Rev. Tony Lorenzen Beautiful and Terrible Things I think our culture is over focussed on happiness. "The pursuit of happiness" is built into American DNA. Being happy is important, but it's completely unrealistic for us to seek to be happy all the time. Perhaps it is unrealistic to seek to be happy in general. I remember the 1988 song by Bobby McFerrin, "Don't Worry, Be Happy." This tune, catchy and upbeat as it is, reflects our culture's unrealistic attitudes toward happiness. The lyric offers a series of what we all might consider negative life experiences and replies to them with "don't worry, be happy,"

I think the song is trying to promote a sense of balance and reminding us to not let all the things that can get us down keep us down. Yet on the surface it seems to say that we just need to change our attitude. I do believe, and research suggests, a power to positive thinking and that meditation, breathing, and stress reduction techniques can and do help us rewire our anxious brains. At the same time, it's important to remember that some people can't and don't experience joy and happiness. Depression saps people of joy. Clinical depression is an epidemic worldwide. It does little good to tell depressed people to cheer up, get over it, or get on with it. The insidious evil of depression robs people of energy, of will, of feeling anything good or bad, happy or sad. As we begin our monthly theme of joy I ask us to remember first that we seek not to be happy all the time, nor are we insensitive to the reality that for some people happiness has been removed from their experience. At the same time, I encourage us to treasure moments of delight, joy, and happiness as they come our way.

Frederick Beuchner wrote "Here is the world. Beautiful and terrible things will happen. Don't be afraid." Treasure the beautiful. Recognize it for the gift it is. Have compassion for the terrible. Most of all, in either case, don't be afraid. Don't be afraid of

the darkness and don't be afraid to revel in and enjoy the light.

We will be standing vigil in meaningful faith-filled presence to protest the non-redemptive nature and violence of the death penalty during the following executions.

March 18,2015 - Randall Mays April 9. 2015 - Kent Sprouse We ask that everyone join together in front of the Walls Unit (at the corner of Ave. I and 12th St.) by 5:30 p.m. the evening of each scheduled execution. Any stay of execution will be published on the church's Facebook page by 5:00 p.m. the day of the scheduled execution. The vigil is usually over by 7:00 p.m. We often hold a candle in visual protest during our vigil as a signal that there is always hope for personal redemption. If you would like to do so, please bring one. Extra candles from church will be provided for those who forget. If any of us have "Standing on the Side of Love" t-shirts, please wear them as a demonstration of faithful solidarity.

The Rev. Tony to Speak at Holy Week Luncheon

Wesley Memorial United Methodist Church will be hosting its annual Holy Week Luncheons each day Monday through Friday of Holy Week, March 30th - April 3rd. The luncheons begin with a meal at noon in the church Fellowship Hall, and feature a different pastor every day sharing a message for the days preceding Easter. Wesley Memorial UMC is located at 700 Hwy 30 in Huntsville. The Rev. Tony will be speaking during Good Friday's Lunch.
