

As I sit down to write this (02/15), severe weather is shaping our lives. Hovering over us, amidst bitter temperatures and winds, realities we take for granted are foremost anxieties: will electricity be interrupted? Will our water lines freeze up? And we think long and hard, before venturing out on the roads?

Like severe weather, the arrival of Lent brings a time of reflection and discipline. Some might ask, "What will I give up?" Yet, I want to pose, "What will you take up?"

What arises in your mind, as you pose those questions in the context of your neighbor? Some are those with whom we are well connected (if not related!), yet others with whom you may be marginally connected. The severe weather plus our extended pandemic, may be impacting the latter in ways you (and I) don't know. Consider as a Lenten discipline, what will I take up to "love my neighbor", especially those less familiar neighbors?

Rather than simply asking "What will I give up for Lent?" consider challenging yourself: "What will I take up for Lent? "Love your neighbor as yourself."

Beyond your neighbor, consider as well "praying" for this transitional time within St John-Prairie Hill.

- ...for your congregational leaders, who find themselves with those added responsibilities, which may have previously been handled by a "full time" called Pastor.
- ...for our ELCA seminaries, which form individuals from ELCA congregations (like St John-Prairie Hill), for pastoral leadership;
- ...for Bishop Rinehart and staff, as they seek to identify gifted candidates, for consideration with congregations seeking to call a new Pastor;
- ...an openness to "ministry imagination" with what the Spirit might be inviting St John to take on anew; and
- ...for patience. Our scriptures tell of Jesus going away, for time to pray and discern.

So, what will you take up, within these 40 days of Lent, that have brought challenges on numerous fronts? How will you open yourself, and your congregation, to the Spirit's nudging?

The Psalms: Songs in the Key of Life

Wednesdays in Lent 2021 Beginning February 24 6:00 p.m.

The Psalms are Hebrew poetry at its best. And what was best about poetry then is still what is best about poetry: no other vehicle better gives expression to the heights and depths of the human experience. In this wonderful book one will find the full spectrum of human emotions. If you can feel it, you can find a psalm about it: joy, sadness, fear, anger, abandonment, tranquility, vengeance, repentance, praise, and helplessness. Sometimes exhilarating, sometimes calming, sometimes shocking, the psalms give us a peek into a very public yet very personal conversation between the author and his God. Nothing is "off" the table. God knows what is in our hearts at any given moment. We can't help but feel what we feel, and the Psalms invite us to take even our "lesser" feelings to God in prayer.

Purpose:

- + To introduce worshipers to the great faith-resource that we have in the Book of Psalms.
- + To lead worshippers into to the understanding that in the book of Psalms you will find every emotion that human beings feel: joy, praise, sadness, fear, anger, contrition, resentment, etc. We can't help but feel what we feel, and the Psalms invite us to take all of it to God in prayer.
- + To encourage worshippers to memorize (hide away in their hearts) entire psalms and portions of psalms so that they can be readily available to them to express their feelings of joy or to be "very present helps in times of trouble."
- + To help worshippers experience the spiritual practice of meditation.
