

#### Greetings!

Like many of you, I continue to reflect on living out my Christian faith in these days of Lent. Traditional emphases have been about deeper practices of prayer, growing in financial generosity, spending time in scripture, feeding the hungry and more.

First, amidst the ongoing reality of COVID-19, a new practice has recently emerged for me out this Biblical passage from Mark 12:28:

• "What commandment is the first of all? Jesus answered, Hear O Israel: the Lord our God the Lord is one. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, "You shall love your neighbor as your-self'. There is no greater commandment than these."

The final two lines in specific, have prompted me to clarify my practices in regards to "wearing a mask" and "social distancing". Whether my leadership has been with the parking lot worship or the "recent social distanced 10:05 worship", my actions had previously been due to an edict of our Texas Governor, and CDC guidelines. Recently however, my motivation has shifted and become guided by a "love for neighbor". That is, until there is sufficient "herd immunity", I am committed to "love my neighbor" by continuing to wear a face mask in public gatherings. Yes, it challenges my speaking within worship and is at times awkward, but I will continue to do so out of love for neighbors that may be more vulnerable because of age, health complications, etc. This has become a core part of my Christian identity this Lent, loving the neighbor God has created and sent into my midst. I appreciate your respect for my leadership on that front, and invite you to join in as well for the benefit of elderly members, and those with health risks,

Second, a follow-up to my initial column of January. My agreed upon responsibilities are Sunday worship at 8:00 a.m. plus 10:05 a.m., and Tuesday afternoon Confirmation class (5:00 p.m.). If there is something additional for which pastoral leadership is traditionally expected, don't assume I know, or am available. My initial written agreement does not include an expectation to attend Council meetings OR be in the office, both of which are often ways a new pastoral leader learns of local expectations (assumptions) for the new Pastoral leader. Over the last few months, retirement life projects have kept me plenty occupied, and no let up is in sight this spring. (As a side note, I explored with Confirmation students the possibility of shifting to "outdoor in person class", but turned out that for now, "online classes" are preferred. If that surprises you, consider that this does not require transportation by Mom or Dad around supper time.)

Third, as you read this we will be in Holy Week 2021 and nearing a celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord. I have no doubt that last year this time, your Holy Week lacked those rich rituals that are so central to our Christian faith. Based on learning safer ways to gather, over recent months (ie social distancing etc), I expect that each of you are personally looking forward to gathering for Palm

Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and of course the Resurrection of our Lord. (My schedule is to be in leadership with you at the Easter Sunday 8:00 and 10:05 celebrations.)

Thanks for your partnership, patience, and persistence in these challenging days to be faithful servants of the Gospel!


