

WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY

Sunday, October 6, 2019

World Communion Sunday is a celebration observed by a number of Christian denominations, taking place on the first Sunday of every October. The purpose of it is to promote Christian unity and ecumenical Christian cooperation. It focuses on an observance of the Lord's Supper, which has as a primary thrust our oneness in Christ Jesus. The tradition was begun in 1933 by Hugh Thomson Kerr, who ministered in the Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA. World Communion Sunday grew out of their attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity -in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another. It was then adopted throughout the US Presbyterian Church in 1936 and subsequently spread to other denominations. In 1940, the Federal Council of Churches (now the National Council of Churches), endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to all Christian churches worldwide. It has always been a special day for me! To know that thousands of churches worldwide seek to express their connection with us in this way makes an already important Christian ritual that much more rich and meaningful. I hope you will partake with us on October 6.

The following items were among the activities, reports and business conducted over the month and during the Regular Meeting of the Session in September...

The first Sunday in September kicked off a new Christian Education season with another success Rally Day where there was great food and fun activities. Thank you to the Congregational Life and Christian Education Committees.

Congregational Life's plans for a dinner & movie night on Friday October 11th featuring the movie "Miracles in Heaven" and, the Christmas Brunch which will be held in Carmel Hall on December 8, 2019

Because the Boy Scout troop at Carmel has been dissolved, Session approved for the balance of the Drumm Fund to be sent to the Boy Scout Cradle of Liberty Boy Scout Council with instructions to the Council that the funds are to be designated to scout troops located in the Carmel Community.

The Property Committee continues to be busy with ongoing maintenance work. The apartment porch will be washed, sanded, scraped, stained and painted including the ceiling and pillars for \$2,450. Also the Manse slate roof will be repaired for \$1,200. All of these repairs are being paid out of the rental funds.

Session approved the deeding of a small strip of land adjacent to the main parking lot retaining wall to the owners of the adjoining property for the price of \$1.00. The Property Committee will take the steps necessary to obtain Presbytery's approval prior to the transfer.

Session approved the close out of the Helen May Drumm Estate account applying the remaining balance of \$71.28 to the cost of the library hallway floor.

Finally, Carmel will be sponsoring a fund raising bake sale for the benefit of Harmony Theatre. The bake sale will be coordinated and run by Bruce and Heide Miller. Date of event to be determined.

CHRIST IS CALLING OUTREACH MISSION - HOW TO LEARN MORE...

Just about one year ago, Carmel Deacons re-envisioned their structure and work. Guided by scripture and the Book of Order, Deacons now concentrate their efforts on Member Care activities such as Meals in a Moment, Transportation, Care Cards, Deacons Fund support to selected beneficiaries, College Student Care Packages and the Prayer Community ... with New Member Outreach and Special Occasions Celebrations just around the corner.

"But, wait a minute!" you say. "What about the Aid for Friends Cook-In? What about the Inter-Faith Food Cupboard? What about the Village Children's Christmas Gift Collection? Don't the Deacons head up these projects?"

The quick answer is "not any longer." BUT, through their revisioning, Deacons encourage and offer members of the congregation who "hear Christ calling" the framework and process to serve in targeted ways...participant, donor, cook, baker, disher, wrapper, deliverer...maybe even as a leader or coordinator every so often.

Examples are Nancy O'Brien managing our ongoing commitment to the Inter-Faith Food Cupboard and Bob Lohoefer coordinating the last, and the next, Cook-In for the newly branded Caring for Friends. Nancy's and Bob's work is not as Deacons, but as members of the Congregation, *supported* by the Deacons.


