

On Wednesday, May 26, at 7:30 p.m., we will come together as a congregation to participate in

the 2021 Bread for the World Offering of Letters. This event will take place on Zoom, as part of the regular Wednesday evening gatherings that have occurred over the past year. As a group, we will first review some information about the state of hunger and poverty in the U. S. and worldwide. Then, we will – on the spot – compose letters to send to our elected federal representatives (in the Senate and House of Representatives). When completed, the letters can be either emailed or USPS mailed the old-fashioned way (better yet ... both!).

Though we have skipped a few years, this will be the 14th year that our congregation has participated in this important letter-writing campaign. That's an impressive demonstration of our continuing advocacy on behalf of poor and hungry families in the U.S. and around the world!

With our letters, we will encourage representatives in Congress to protect important programs like SNAP and tax credits for low-income families. We will also encourage them to increase U.S. leadership and funding for global nutrition programs.
