

### Reading: 2 Corinthians 8:7-15

<sup>7</sup>Now as you excel in everything — in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in utmost eagerness, and in our love for you — so we want you to excel also in this generous undertaking.

<sup>8</sup>I do not say this as a command, but I am testing the genuineness of your love against the earnestness of others.<sup>9</sup>For you know the generous act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich.

<sup>10</sup>And in this matter I am giving my advice: it is appropriate for you who began last year not only to do something but even to desire to do something —

<sup>11</sup>now finish doing it, so that your eagerness may be matched by completing it according to your means.

<sup>12</sup>For if the eagerness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has — not according to what one does not have.

<sup>13</sup>I do not mean that there should be relief for others and pressure on you, but it is a question of a fair balance between<sup>14</sup>your present abundance and their need, so that their abundance may be for your need, in order that there may be a fair balance.<sup>15</sup>As it is written, "The one who had much did not have too much, and the one who had little did not have too little."

Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well, and live." <sup>24</sup>So he went with him.

And a large crowd followed him and pressed in on him.

<sup>25</sup>Now there was a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years. <sup>26</sup>She had endured much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had; and she was no better, but rather grew worse.

<sup>32</sup>He looked all around to see who had done it.


<sup>33</sup>But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling, fell down before him, and told him the whole truth.






