HELPING LOCAL RESIDENTS

Chester County Officials announce donation opportunities that will meet the most urgent initial, and longer-term needs of the families displaced by Hurricane Ida.

For the **Phoenixville** and surrounding community, go to <u>inthistogetherpxv.com</u> to make a donation, and note that it is for Hurricane Ida relief.

For the City of **Coatesville**, go to the **Brandywine Health Foundation**'s website, <u>brandywinefoundation.org/donate</u>, to donate to the Coatesville Red Umbrella Response Fund. This fund is a collaborative effort of the City of Coatesville, Brandywine Valley Active Aging, the Brandywine Health Foundation and a host of non-profit partners to help the hardest hit areas of the city.

For the **Downingtown** and surrounding area, the **Lord's Pantry** is coordinating financial donations. Go to <u>lordspantryofdowningtown.org</u>, and note that it is for flood victim relief.
