

Hello Christus Victor,

John 1:5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

During the month of March we will hit the 1 year mark of the time our lives have been altered due to Covid-19. It has been a challenging time for all of us as individuals and within our families as well as a community of faith. Through it all, the community of faith at Christus Victor Lutheran Church have adapted in order to continue in the ministry God has called us to. There are things that need improvement for sure, but those who worship here have done all they can to assure that we have the personnel and equipment to assure that we could worship together as a community despite the fact that we could not be together physically. By the closing of the year it felt like we may never find our way back to something that felt normal; not just in the church, but in our daily lives. However......

There is a light shining before us. With the development of several different vaccines to combat Covid-19, we can finally see that it will be possible for us to come back into the sanctuary and sit next to each other, walk forward, and receive communion at the altar, and even gather without wearing masks. We are not there yet, and it will likely be the fall before the masks are taken off, but, there is a light shining in this darkness. But will church ever be what it was before that Pandemic?

As I heard that the vaccines were available to the most vulnerable in our communities, I began to get excited knowing that people would be able to come together and feel safe. I imagined what it would look like as more and more of our members started filling up the church again. But I quickly learned that for some, getting the shots is simply not the fixer of all things Covid for some individuals. There is still a concern about strains of the newer strains of the virus the reality that you could still get covid but the symptoms will likely not be severe. Once again I found myself worried about our congregation and it's ability to sustain itself with a lower number of people in the sanctuary on Sunday mornings, and the reality that many have appreciated the convenience of being able to worship in their living rooms, probably in their pajamas. How will the church continue to be the church? How can we provide support and ministry if people are not coming to the church for worship or programs? And again, a light shined in the darkness.

The clergy in our Synod have done a lot of communicating with each other as all are learning as we go when it comes to being the church when we cannot gather. These conversations range from how to work a video camera to live streaming and if we should have communion over the airways and if so, how does that work? To have these colleagues as resources and a support system has been invaluable. I also began reading "The Virtual Body of Christ in a suffering world" by Deanna Thompson.

In what I have read so far (I am so bad at making time just to read), I am reminded of how significant the connection that we make on-line or Virtually, are. She talks about her experience of using the "Caring Bridge" website to disseminate information about her journey with stage IV cancer journey. I was reminded of how important my daily emails to more people than I count became when we were going through our daughter's cancer journey. Not only was I able to share the details of what was going on with her treatment to a vast number of people and relieve the burden of having to actually tell so many people the same information; this email provided a way for me to share my struggles in this journey, and then receive support and encouragement from more people than I could have imagined. That support was not less than in person support. It truly was a lifeline to me on many occasions.

In the description of the book on Amazon it says: "This book begins with a conversion story of a non-cell phone owning, non-Facebook using religion professor judgmental of the ability of digital tools to enhance relationships." While I feel lost when I can't find my cell phone and, I cherish the way Facebook has provided me with a way to reconnect and stay connected to people who are very important to me but do not live near me, I have always been a skeptic of the "Televangelists" of the world. As every pastor has become a sort of Televangelist of sorts, I have worried more than I care to admit that online worship was "worship light". Surely people cannot worship as deeply from their living room as they can when we gather in-person. I have always believed that there is great value in recording worship so our shut-ins can "at least" see the service. I had never considered that this resource would allow our "Shut-in" to WORSHIP not just watch the service. And so, now I have to begin to learn, discover, and develop ways in which our church can thrive in this digital age. At the end of the day, there are two things I want to say about where we are as a church and where we are going.

First, it is important that every person who comes to Christus Victor Lutheran Church knows that we are doing whatever is necessary to take care of everyone. Even as more and more individuals are able to get their vaccines, we will continue to wear masks and keep social distance in place until everyone has had the opportunity to receive the vaccine. This may be as late as the fall, but that is all dependent on the availability of the vaccines and the distribution, both of which we have no control over. In the end, we know that there will never be 100% certainty that you will not get the virus. There will always be a measure of balancing living life and being safe. Only you can decide what that means for you. At some point we won't wear masks in church and we will begin to sit next to each other and even hug. Each of us will need to decide what we are comfortable with and what we feel is unsafe. Also, each of us will have to mindful of everyone else in the room and not assume it is okay to hug. Before we make any physical contact with someone it will be important we know what they are comfortable with. We cannot be offended if we are told that someone prefers that we not hug them. I know this will change our sharing of the peace, but at least we will be able to share the peace more closely.

Last but not least, we need to mindful that the church will never be the same. This will be challenging and uncomfortable. Isn't that true whenever things change? BUT..... This is not bad. I know that the inclination is to lament that things are different. The fact that what is familiar and provided us comfort the aren't same will likely make us feel a bit disconnected to the church and/or the church community. These are reasonable INI-TIAL reactions to the big changes that are happening in the church and the world. Then, when we have acknowledged our discomfort and disconnectedness, it is time for us to come together and figure out how the sense of being connected to one another and God can happen in this digital age. I have some ideas of which I have no concrete plans yet, but I want you to be thinking about ways we can be the church together. It is going to be a process that takes all of us who are called as Children of God, to embrace the way life is in 2021 and beyond, and use the wonderful technological resources in ways that share God's love and grace with the world. I truly pray that you will go with me on this journey as we move forward from the darkness we have felt for the last year and move to the light that Christ provides to help us through the darkness. Put your virtual tennis shoes on and walk with me as we move forward!




