Hello Christus Victor Family and friends:

Matthew 18:19-20 "Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on Earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." The first of those two verses is one that I have struggled with and I think I have finally figured out why. Every three years Matthew 18:15-20 comes up in the Revised Common Lectionary. That means I preach on this text at least once every 3 years. That has never been an issue for me. But verse 19: "Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on Earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven"; has been misused in ways that made me uncomfortable. This verse has been used when there is something difficult going on in someone's life, or when there is a particular job or ministry that a person wants to be a part of.

First of all, I am always concerned when we imply that God is somehow manipulated to do the things we want done if we have "Enough" people who join us in that want, or if we pray at just the right time and in just the right way. I truly believe that God listens to and answers the prayers of the overwhelmed individual who cries out in desperation as much as, and maybe more than God pays attention to bunch of people trying to bend God to do what we think should be done.

I know that the people who came to me, or who go to anyone who is hurting and deeply in need, are not intending to try to manipulate God. Loving people have a great need to do something to "fix" the hurt. None of us is overly comfortable with simply sitting with someone in their struggle when we have no answer to share. However, I think we miss the point and the beauty of this text.

This verse is a part of Matthew 18:15-20. In this part of scripture Jesus talks about how to deal with a member of the community "sins against you". As someone who has had to carefully execute this mandate, I know that it is not easy to lovingly and faithfully deal with someone who chooses not to work within the community. But, when we are able to come together as God's people, listening to one another more than we are talking, we find the way to be the community of faith that God intends us to be. When we pay close attention to both verse 19 and 20 together, all of a sudden verse 19 doesn't seem to be a way to bend God to our will. It is a way to draw on the collective gifts, talents and compassion of the community in order to face the very difficult things that are a part of this life.

Read these verses together - "Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on Earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." Maybe we could say it like this: "When the community of faith is able to work together, anything is possible. When we work together and pray together and listen to one another, the Spirit intercedes to help us discover how each individual is a part of God's great plan to care for all of God's creation. Together we discover our differences are a great gift. We find that God works through each of us to bring God's love and grace to all people. We are the church. The Body of our Lord. We are the Body of Christ for the world. We have the privilege and the responsibility as children of God of being a servant of all. It just doesn't seem that anything in what Jesus says or does tells us it is okay to say "What's in it for me" when it comes to the Christian faith. We ARE claimed children of God called and sent.

"Give me" should not be in our vocabulary. Together, with all the members of the Body of Christ, we provide what the world needs to know and understand the loving God we serve.

As Covid has put a big damper on our ability to be together, it is all the more important that we find ways of connecting with the other parts of Body so that we can continue to serve God completely.

This month we will be providing 2 opportunities for people to come together. We will do what we can to be as safe as possible. But we will come together for Trunk or Treat and for our Reformation dinner. I hope that you will help me in finding ways to keep the most vulnerable safe, while also allowing us to be the church together. I am looking forward to seeing all of you, but especially those who have been isolated for so long.

If you are still not comfortable being with people outside your home, please help me find ways to allow you to be with people so that you can be safe and not so isolated. From wherever we are, let us be the church together!

God bless you all Pastor Tammy Thank you for bearing with us on the audio/visual glitches we have been having with streaming the service. We should have those fixed now. Nothing is more frustrating than technology that does not work correctly. We want to make sure that those of you who choose to watch us online do not miss out on the experience.

Martin Luther was voted the third most influential person behind Johannes Gutenberg who invented the printing press and Sir Isaac Newton who discovered the laws of motion. In fact, it was Gutenberg's printing press that helped spread the list of 95 these to the people. According to Wikipedia, 300,000 copies of Luther's tracts were distributed throughout Germany and Europe in a span of two years. This was a major feat in the early 1500's. Remember to wear red on 10/31/2021 to commemorate the Reformation that Luther started with the help of the printing press.











