Dear Christus Victor Family and Friends:

I am already hearing Christmas music and the Hallmark channel has begun its season of Christmas movies but, I want to take some time to appreciate a time of Thanksgiving.

Recently I have been reminded of so many things I have to be Thankful for. Maybe if I share a few of them it will help you to think about what you have to be thankful for.

In the last couple of weeks, I have had several notices pop up on my newsfeed on Facebook from some of "my kids". As a former Youth Director, Associate In Ministry and Synodically Authorized Minister, and now a pastor, I have been blessed to work with so many amazing kids. Well, they were kids at the time. Now they are moms, and dads and youth workers and writers and artists and dedicated students and the list goes on and on. Each time I see one of their posts I am reminded of moments in ministry when it wasn't me teaching or guiding them but rather, they were the ones teaching me. They made me laugh. We cried together. We celebrated big days and we shared how God continued to be with us in the rough times. They asked questions that challenged me and then worked with me to find answers when there were answers. They taught me how to listen, and how to hold my tongue. They taught me that faith isn't always expressed in traditional ways and that the Spirit moves in ways we never imagined. I am THANKFUL for all of the kids I have worked with over the years and the ways that God has touched my life through them.

I am grateful that God has taught me the ministry of Presence. As a person who seemed to speak before she thought through much of my youth, I have learned the importance of silent presence in ministry. There are circumstances in which there is very little that can be said and yet, there is a great need for a person to not be alone. Being able to sit with someone and allow them to respond however they need to without judgement or correction can make a world of difference.

I am grateful to be serving in a congregation that understands the challenges that I as the pastor have dealt with in the past year. When our worship services were done from my cell phone in my back yard, with a plane flying through the service (the noise not the actual plane), this congregation was still able to appreciate the chance to worship in spite of the odd distractions. This congregation has understood that while I wasn't in the office all the time, I was working crazy hours trying to put together meaningful worship services while in quarantine. When we were able to gather in the sanctuary again but needed to wear masks to keep everyone safe, this congregation did what needed to be done with very little complaining. When we had to go back to wearing masks because of the new strain of Covid, no one was happy but everyone understood. You have been supportive and understanding and it still has worn out this pastor trying to learn how to be the best servant I can be in this new world we live in. So many of my colleagues have faced the same challenges without this understanding. Thank you for living the Gospel to your pastor.

I am so very grateful for my neighbors. As a child I knew all of the neighbors and they knew me. I also knew that none of them were worried about correcting me if I was doing something I shouldn't. The parents in the neighborhood had an understanding... Treat them as if they were your own. I now have neighbors who feel like family. We share meals together. Our children (their children and our grandchildren) play together and fight like siblings. We gather in the our backyard to swim, and in our neighbors front yard to watch the kids play in the street. In a world in which most people are so busy with their own lives to have time for neighbors, we are blessed with neighbors who feel like family.

I am grateful for my family. Rick has come into his home as the grandpa and our grandchildren barely say hi to me before they ask where Papa is. He is the one to play hide and seek and not get weary. He is the one that will eat whatever meal they bring him from the play kitchen and tell them how delicious it was. He has become a far better house keeper than I am, but I am still the cook. Our son and daughter-in-law have worked so hard to start their own businesses and have encouraged and supported each other along the way, even when it has been tough. They are amazing parents to possibly the greatest blessing in our lives, the two sassy, beautiful girls who call us Mimi and Papa. Family truly is a gift.

Finally, it may sound strange for me to say, but I am grateful for the challenges I have faced in the last year. Oh, I would avoid them if I could. I don't like being pushed in ways I don't expect. But with every challenge and struggle, I have learned to rely on the strength that comes only from faith in God. I have learned to let go of things I really cannot change or control. That has not been fun. I have learned that when I think that nothing good is going to come out of a time of worship because I am a bit disjointed, I am forced to remember that worship isn't about me. Worship is about the body of Christ coming together to worship the God of love and grace. Worship happens when the people of God encounter the Spirit of God and sometimes, I get to be a part of that. Sometimes the Spirit bails me out! Challenge is not fun but it does us me to remember that God is doing God's work not me. For that, I am deeply grateful.

This list could go on for a lot longer but I think you get the point. Hold off jumping into the Christmas season and take a moment to simply give thanks. Take time to really think about what you are grateful for. Think of the little things we sometime take for granted or the relationships that are no longer central to our lives but had an impact on our lives of faith that is still significant. Your list will be different than mine. God knows our varied needs. And before we begin to prepare for the coming of the Christ Child, let us take some time to give thanks!
