



Christus Victor Family and Friends:

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you." John 15:12-15

As a kid growing up in the church, this image of Jesus as my friend was so comforting. In many ways, I think that being invited into a friendship with Jesus is what allowed me to feel very connected to Jesus and therefore my faith. Because of this relationship I wanted to learn more and to be with other people who also understood this invitation to friendship. Growing up in the 80's and being a part of a very large youth group, we sang the song "You've God a Friend" as if Jesus were singing it to us. It is the understanding of Jesus I needed, and I am forever grateful for.

As I listen to the preachers that so many people are drawn to, they spend most of their time expressing this personal Jesus. Let's face it. One the most exciting things about our faith is that we are invited to be as close to God as a friend. We are encouraged to hear "I will never leave you nor forsake you." Through the good and the bad, God is with us. I know this to be true and have felt God's presence in mighty ways when life seemed unbearable. But if our faith simply rests in the comfort of knowing Jesus as our friend, I think we are missing the point of our lives.

One of the things that was said so often during talks at my youth group was something like this: "If you had been the only person in the world Jesus would have still come down and died for you". I know the point of that was to emphasize the fact that God wants an intimate relationship with us, but as far as I can tell, I don't think the Bible ever says that. It isn't that I don't think God loves me enough to do that. It is the fact that we were never created to be isolated individuals. We were created to be in community with one another and with God. To imply that God would ever want Just me is to lose sight of who we are created to be. Our faith is personal, but it isn't private. I cannot hold on to Jesus as my friend as if Jesus is not your friend too. God came for all of us, not just one of us. And Christ came not just to save us, but to teach us how we are to live our lives as worship to our Lord.

At the birth of Jesus, the shepherds were joined by an angel proclaiming "for unto you this day, in the city of David, a Savior is born, who is Christ the Lord." Luke 2:11 Before Jesus could do anything but coo and sleep and mess up his diapers, He was Lord of all. The shepherds felt that power and came to the manger to honor this new Lord and then went out to tell the world.

When the Wisemen came from the East, they bowed down before Jesus as they presented his family with precious and costly gifts. They understood the Greatness of this Child even though he was just a kid being a kid.

For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, abounding in riches for all who call on Him; Romans 10:12

Through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we have been given this gift of understanding support. We can no longer say that God is out there somewhere and doesn't really care what is happening down on earth. Jesus showed us what it is to have God be the Lord of our lives and I think that we have managed to water down what this means.

The dictionary says that the word Lord means *someone or something having power, authority, or influence; a master or ruler*. It is giving Jesus the power, authority, and influence of our lives that we seem reluctant to embrace. It is this Lordship of Jesus that can not only change our lives, but it will change the world. That is, if all of us work to keep our friend Jesus as our Lord as well.

So, what do I really mean? Consider the Bible verses or poems or sayings that you are on your walls or on a desk or just in your collection of things that you draw on when you consider your relationship with God. I am willing to bet that most of them have to do with how God in Jesus Christ has come to you. "I can do all things through Christ who Strengthens me". Philippians 4:13 The Lord is my Shepherd I shall not want..... "Psalm 23 And the list could go on. The point I am trying to make is that unintentionally perhaps, we are prone to allow our faith to be "What can Jesus do for me". Of course we never think of it this way, but our lives seem to reflect that far more than reflecting that Jesus is the Lord of our lives.

For us to reflect that Jesus is Lord of our lives, our lives should be focused on others more than on ourselves. Our response to people would always be in love rather than demanding our way. We would see the hurt in others and instinctually offer what we could to help rather than considering all the reasons we shouldn't get involved. When the challenges of life come our way, our response would be more of "Lord, what would you have me do through this" rather than, "why is God doing this to me". Let's face it. Those are not the most common responses we have.

I challenge all of us to gather with other people of faith, or people who would be interested in reading the Bible with you regardless of their faith, and look for all of the instructions that Jesus gives on how to live our lives. Consider the things that are most important to Jesus like Love and acceptance and sacrifice. Then, challenge one another to hold each other accountable for living the way Jesus instructs us to. That means in the way we disagree with people, and the way we talk to people, and the way we respond to the needs of others. Take little steps each day to live into the Lordship of Jesus, allowing God's ways to be the authority, influence, and master of our lives. It won't be easy, but I do believe that as we live into this relationship with Jesus we will more fully know what is meant when we are promised to have life and life abundantly.


We are open for business!!



Grace Unbounded provides daily devotions for each day from Ash Wednesday to the Vigil of Easter (traditionally known as Holy Saturday). Devotions begin with an evocative image and a brief passage from the Gospel of Luke (the gospel focus for 2022, year C in the Revised Common Lectionary). The writers then bring their unique voices and pastoral wisdom to the texts with quotations to ponder, reflections, and prayers.

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus reaches out to all kinds of people. He proclaims good news-in particular, to those experiencing poverty, oppression, or captivity. Despite the tensions at the time between Jewish people and Samaritans, he tells a story about a Samaritan who shows what it means to be a neighbor. Jesus also


responds to those who want healing, welcomes time with children, shows great regard for women, shares meals with "unsavory" characters, and seeks out people who have lost their way. No limits, no restrictions, no boundaries—not even death—can stop his love and grace for all people.

USING grace unbounded IN YOUR HOME EACH DAY

On your own

- If possible, light a candle and set a small bowl of water next to it. (Hint: Turn off electronic devices at this time.)
- · Look at the photo for the day, read the devotion, and pray the prayer. Add to the prayer if you wish.
- Dip your fingers into the water and make the sign of the cross on your forehead.

With others

- If possible, light a candle and set a small bowl of water next to it. (Hint: Turn off electronic devices) at this time.)
- Look at the photo for the day together. (With a child or children, ask a question about the photo, for example: What do you like about this picture? What do you think happens next? How do you feel when you look at this picture? What does this picture make you want to do?)
- With a child or children, use the Bingo card and drawing prompts provided in order to keep younger participants engaged.
- Have one person read the scripture passage and "To ponder" quote aloud, and another read the reflection. Pray the prayer aloud together.
- Dip your fingers into the water and make the sign of the cross on each other's foreheads.

Tips

- Make devotions a daily habit, like brushing your teeth. Many people find it helpful to have devotions at the same time and place every day (or most days)—at a table before or during a meal, on the bus or train to school or work, in a child's room at bedtime. Do what works best for
- Don't give up if you miss a day! Move ahead to the next devotion the following day.
- If you are using Grace Unbounded with others, consider putting someone in charge of making sure you take time for daily devotions. (Children especially may enjoy this responsibility!)


