#### **Meet Sam**

Sam molests children. Hear him tell how he gets away with it. Participants will learn:

#### **Preventing Sexual Activity Between Adolescents**

When adolescents bully or act out sexually with one another, these behaviors not only violate policy, they can become abusive. Participants will learn:

- Steps they can take to prevent sexual activity between adolescents
- How to respond if sexual activity between adolescents occurs

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#### **Abuse Prevention Refresher**

- The importance of acting on warning signs, and how to do so
