The Ministry of Operation Christmas Child is Alive and Well this year, just in a different form than we are used to!! You can pack a box at the Church today, Sunday, September 27th 11:30 a.m. – 3:00 p.m., Monday, September 28th, 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m., Tuesday, September 29th, 1:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. Please make a reservation via Realm or call the office.

If you would like to help with shipping costs, \$9.00/box, we are accepting donations and we are providing bottles to collect quarters or loose change for the next several months. These are available in the vestibule of the church. Let's see who can beat the quarter collection we've started in the church office!

Last year, Unity filled 253 Shoeboxes and exceeded its 2019 goal! As a result, we decided to make our 2020 goal 350 boxes to be collected from members, family and friends. We have already filled over 150 boxes! There are four options this year:

Option A - You may fill a box online through the OCC website. It is a simple process that takes only a few minutes and a credit card. These boxes typically go to the "hard to reach" areas with the strictest customs regulations.

Option B - We have a supply of empty boxes available at the church. You can call the church 412-561-2431 and pick some up at the church or Terri Molnar would be glad to drop off at your home the number you want to fill and pick them up when they are ready,

Option C – Packing at the church. We will have an area in the transept set up where individuals and "family groups" may come to the church by appointment. We will have the usual supplies and items to pack boxes, but, unfortunately, we are not able to enjoy a large group atmosphere.

Option D- Donations for supplies or shipping will be gladly accepted. We have been purchasing at seasonal clearance sales and we started the year with a nice donation. Samaritan's Purse/OCC has also been generous in providing quantities of "start up" boxes, given the times we are in! Options A, B, and D can be done at any time.

Stewardship Snapshot

Special Note: As we practice social distancing, our ministries continue although procedures have been modified. We have worship on Sunday morning on Facebook Live, and we are able to watch it any time during the week since they are recorded. We have limited attendance at our services. We are not able to "pass the plate" during worship in the typical fashion. We rely on you to send your envelopes to the church in the mail, arrange for your bank to send your check to the church, make use of online giving (go to www.unitypresbyterianchurch.org, select the "Donate" button and follow the prompts) or you can even use our Facebook page which also has a Donate function.

Remember that even though we are not able to meet in person for worship, the missions of the church continue during this critical time.

Based upon the approved expense budget, Envelope Giving needs to be \$7921 per week without having to use other sources of income or reserves. The average weekly envelope giving was \$5921 or a little more than \$19/member.
