**2021 Year-End Contribution Statements.** To prepare for the distribution of final, year-end contribution statements for the 2021, the pledge campaign for 2021 has been closed. No additional contributions can be added for 2021. Online donors will no longer see an option to donate to their 2021 pledge. As we have done since 2018, the YE statements for 2021 will be generated from Realm. Each Statement will include contributions, pledge data, and a fund summary. As a reminder, please check your Realm profile and ensure that your Contact Email is accurate. Statements will be sent via email, and mailed to those who do not have email. The target date for distribution to begin is January 26<sup>th</sup>. Mailed statements will take longer to be delivered by the Post Office.

You can track and print your own Giving History. As you give throughout the year, keep track of it within your Realm profile's giving history. This lists all of your contributions, whether they're manual, online, through text, or pledges to a campaign. The date range you select determines the gifts you see, and you can print a list of your current gifts or contributions you've given in the past. To print your giving history:

- Click Giving on the main menu.
- If necessary, filter your contributions to get a list of the ones you want.
- Click the printer icon. A PDF downloads that you can open in your browser. Pledge data will display at the bottom of your statement.

This statement can include nondeductible gifts and is available to you all year, but should not be used for tax purposes. Although you will receive a Year-End Statement at the end of January, a button specifically for year-end taxes displays from February 1st to April 30<sup>th</sup>, in case you to print it from Realm. # **Stewardship Snapshot**

We rely on you to send your donations to the church in the mail, arrange for your bank to send your check to the church, make use of online giving (go to www.unitypresbyterianchurch.org, select the "Donate" button and follow the prompts).

More people have chosen to use the convenience of online giving. It can be linked to your bank account or credit card. **Online giving totaled \$10,708 in December**. There were 65 online donations.

**Per Capita**- 29 members have paid their per capita so far. As a church, Unity owes \$10,500 whether donated as per capita or not. It's \$35 per member and this has not been increased in a number of years. We only need 250 more to reach the goal.

FOOD PANTRY - \$500 was donated this week.

**COVENANT COMMITMENT CARDS**- thanks to the 48 families that have been returned. If you haven't done it yet, please fill out the cards and return them to the church. Our goal is \$205,000. We are currently \$36,000 short of that goal. People have already given over \$16,000 to fulfill their commitment of giving for 2022. It would be especially great if we could exceed the goal.
