

Some people are feeling chained down by the restrictions to remain in our homes due to Covid19, or feeling chained down by illness. Some are feeling chained down by the fear of going to the doctor. In II Timothy 2:9 the Apostle Paul tells about his suffering and being chained like a criminal. But the word of God cannot be chained. The Word of God comes to us as the breath of life. The promises of God will bring daily blessing if you open your Bible either physically or electronically. Nothing can keep the encouragement and wonder of the Word of God from infusing your life if you open yourself to it.

I left the church on Wednesday and headed to the grocery store to pick up a few things Judy had asked me to get, and it was a strange feeling as it was so quiet on the streets. Social distancing was easy in the store as I was nearly alone (although one of our members spotted me as he was out on a similar mission). These times are easy for me as I am naturally an introvert and have no problem being alone. I have an advantage living in the country to get outside multiple times each day and have many things to do while I am out. I take care of the chickens and cats, throw stones off the lawn and back onto the driveway, there are lots of sticks and branches to pick up after winter storms... My point is to encourage you to get outside even if you don't have jobs to do out there. A little exercise and moving around has both physical and spiritual benefits as we are invigorated, besides, those are wonderful times to turn your mind to God and lift up others in prayer.

I hope you have taken the opportunity to join in worship either on Sunday morning with the video on our local cable channel or KILR radio. These have been a real blessing for our members and many more in our community. My son Josh has been working to improve the video possibilities in his church and has shared some things with me that I hope to incorporate into our system. The last two Sundays I have done a livestream on my Dave Ullom Facebook page, and you can go there at any time to take in our service at any time that fits best with your schedule at www.facebook.com/dave.ullom. I was blessed on Monday to receive a text from my son Ben as he quoted one of the scriptures I had used in the middle of the sermon. He was escorting prisoners to the hospital and had time while he waited for them. I have received many such blessings with 142 who have watched the first service and over 100 the second so far.

Those numbers are far higher than would have joined in without this crisis keeping us away from worship. What a blessing! Please support our worship with your prayers. Pray for the music and message. Pray a blessing for those who tune in. Pray for expanding the ministry God is giving us through this time.

We have cancelled our Maundy Thursday plans. I don't know what will happen with Easter worship, but we all need to take the extra effort to keep in contact with others. Pick up the phone, send a text, or send a card – especially for our elderly.

Put a sign of hope in your window. One of our members has suggested cutting out an image of an angel and taping it in your window to remind yourself and others that God sends His angels, His messengers, to watch over us (Psalm 91:11-12). Be a messenger of God and bring blessing to others... it is guaranteed to flow back to you: "Whoever brings blessing will be enriched, and one who waters will himself be watered." Proverbs 11:25.
