

Pastor's Ponderings Cont.

Each worship situation is different just as each person's situation is different. Churches in Emmet County with o Covid-19 cases and bordered by counties with 0, 1, and 5 cases are far different than Blackhawk with 941 cases, Polk with 813 or Woodbury at 695. There is plenty of space in our sanctuary to allow families to have a 10 foot distancing and we have the balcony. I don't know how many of you might like to attend worship again and how many might choose to continue to join us from home, but...

With Gov. Kim Reynolds removing restrictions on congregations gathering for worship, our Session voted to approve opening worship for those who would like to attend. However, with an eye toward taking extra measures to protect the health of those who attend, our worship will look different than we are used to.

We will make the following adjustments to keep our members far safer than a visit to the grocery store or other businesses in town.

- 1. Anyone who does not feel comfortable attending worship due to age or underlying physical conditions, or is not feeling well, is encouraged to stay home and continue joining us in worship via TV, radio or Facebook.
- 2. Someone will be stationed at the two outside doors to open them for attendees so no one needs to touch a surface that someone else has touched. The handrail on the stairs will need to be sanitized if used.
- 3. Hand sanitizer will be available at the entrances.
- 4. Offering plates will be placed in the back of the sanctuary and will not be passed to collect the offering. Bulletins will be laid out individually to pick up when you enter the sanctuary.
- 5. We will not move around to Pass the Peace, or get closer than 6 feet from each other at any time, including while entering or exiting the church, or for conversation.
- 6. Masks may be worn if you feel more comfortable doing so, or to protect others in case you may have contracted the virus and are without symptoms.
- 7. Those who count the offering should use gloves or wash or sanitize their hands before touching their face or other items

I trust that following these measures will grant us the sense of freedom in worship that will glorify God as we take steps to move forward in our current world situation. It is important for us to be vigilant with our hygiene, washing our hands frequently, covering a cough or sneeze with an elbow, keeping safe distances, but even more importantly, we need to be in prayer that this virus will be eliminated, we need to continue to pray for the safety of those in our community. We need to pray for those working in services around us, and finding our way through opening businesses around us, in our state and the nation. We pray for healing and restoration.
