



Pastor's Ponderings



I pray that these words find you well. The greatest struggle that I have had for the last couple months is a loss of connection with many. I am thankful that in the last month we have been able to lift up praises to God and worship together in person. Half of the normal body that gathered pre-corona has been coming together during the month of May.

Pastor's Ponderings Cont.

The greatest loss has been one of being unable to visit our shut-ins. The separation has been most specifically onerous when I have not been able to visit the hospital. Phone calls lack a human touch. The lesson I draw from this is that I (we) need to make a greater effort to be connected. That is what this coming Sunday is really all about – the celebration of Pentecost.

But, what in the world is Pentecost??? The word "Pentecost" designates the 50th day after Passover, which was a Feast Day. Also known as the Feast of Weeks or Feast of Harvest.

The Book of Acts records that it was on this day that the Holy Spirit was poured out on 120 or so followers of Christ who were gathered in an Upper Room in Jerusalem. It was on this day that the Church was born in a literal blaze of Glory complete with visions like tongues of fire appearing on their heads.

Dr. Jerry Vines has written that, "The average Christian and the average Church are bogged down somewhere between Calvary and Pentecost. They have been to Calvary for pardon, but they have not been to Pentecost for power. Bethlehem means God with us. Calvary means God for us. But Pentecost means God <u>in</u> us." Many Christians do not understand the role of the Holy Spirit and they have not connected with the power of the Holy Spirit in their own personal lives.

I think that those thoughts are especially important for us in the midst of the current crisis. It is easy for us to feel helpless and powerless as we face an invisible virus and there is no way for us to know who is safe for us to be near and who isn't. This meant less to us a month ago when there were no positive cases identified in Emmet County than it does today as I write these words and there are 7, and I am sure that number will rise in the coming days. I am thankful to note that 3 of those 7 have already recovered, and I pray that each of those who experience this affliction will be strengthened and healed.

Pentecost reminds me that these are not just empty phrases or hoping that things will work out for the best. Pentecost means connecting with power. The Holy Spirit coming to dwell within us means we are plugged into God. Acts 1:8 promises, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

We are gifted with the Power of Worship as the Holy Spirit helps us to worship God in spirit and in truth. Real worship demands participation no matter if you are at home or in a sanctuary. The Holy Spirit will help you to worship God in the Spirit and help you lift your soul to touch God's heart with yours.

We are gifted with the Power of Prayer. John 16:23-24 promises: "Whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you. Until now you have asked nothing in my name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full." Pentecost reminds us that there is power in our prayers, that when we ask in the will of God, i.e. in the name of Jesus, the prayer of faith will bring healing (James 5:15).

So, on Sunday morning put on something red, gather around the TV, radio, computer or sanctuary and worship in the power of Pentecost!
