Pastor's Ponderings



A few years ago, a pastor took an online poll asking, "What is the point of the church?" Responses ranged from personal opinions to Scriptural references to quotations from the Westminster Catechism. The response that I found most poignant was an observation about the wildly divergent answers that read, "If you ask any of the employees at Chick-Fil-A what the purpose of the company is, they will all say the same thing. Everyone knows it. Yet these posts show that Christians have very different understandings of what the point of the church is." Since Jesus died for the church, shouldn't we know its purpose?

Pastor's Ponderings Cont.

Our modern confusion stands at odds with the early church's strong sense of purpose. Jesus' first followers were constantly involved in spreading the good news about his death and resurrection (Mat. 28:18-20). Then, as these followers joined together in communities where Jesus was treasured and people were cared for (Acts 2:37-47), their long-term strategy was sharing the Good News of Jesus with more people.

The world has changed around us, and that change has accelerated in the last year. I began writing about this last month and shared some of the things I and the Session have been working on to help us move forward. We have been asking you to sign up for a discussion group, and now it is important for everyone connected with our worshipping fellowship to participate in one of those groups. Each group will meet two times and complete a Congregational Study that I have compiled. I searched for some kind of instrument to help guide us and asked for help from the Presbytery, but when none was forthcoming, I worked to put an instrument together myself and pray that God will use it to help us plan for future ministry.

Copies of Session One of the Congregational Study are available on the bulletin tables in the sanctuary, and I will email them to all those who I have an address for so you can write down responses before we come together in groups to discuss. In the groups one person's responses can connect with another or spark further ideas that we will compile anonymously and use to move forward. Please contact me or the church office to have a copy mailed to you. Please contact me if you would rather participate in one of the groups via a Zoom connection and I will set up a link.

The first group will meet on **Tuesday, June 1**, at 7:00 pm and again June 8. Two more groups will meet after worship **Sunday June 6** and June 13.

There are not right or wrong decisions for us, but perhaps there are choices between what is good and what is better. We seek to be led by God and pray that direction will come through these discussions together. I read an article this week that said the Southern Baptist Convention, the largest protestant denomination, since its peak in 2006 has lost 14% of its membership through 2019, United Methodists lost 18% in that time, and unfortunately PCUSA (us) had a 42.5% membership decline over those years. Our congregation has mirrored that decline and that indicates to me that we need to consider doing ministry differently.

Eph. 3:20-21 promises, "Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, ²¹ to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen."

I know that the Lord has a plan for us: "The plans I have for you... are plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope. In those days when you pray, I will listen. If you look for me wholeheartedly, you will find me." Jeremiah 29:11-14. Please pray for these discussions and our church.
