



# Pastor's Ponderings



We were able to conduct the Congregational Study with two groups that met twice each. We had some very good exchanges and a good round of thoughts and ideas have begun to come out of them. I will share the responses I recorded during the sessions, although we have too many for this newsletter, so I will share just the first part of the responses. It is also important that we continue to collect responses and ideas that can be sent or dropped off at the office, or delivered to me via email. I found the Tuesday sessions to be the most enjoyable as we had more time to consider the questions together and enjoy one another's responses.

# Pastor's Ponderings Cont.

I think the most telling question to begin with was, "What do you think our congregation will look like in 20 years if we continue the pattern of the last 20 years without operating differently?" The responses were unanimous, the church will be: empty; it won't be here; many said it will be closed.

That seems a very clear mandate to me. I don't accept that it is God's will and purpose for this congregation to end its ministry and close the church, and that can only mean that we need to do some things differently in the way we do ministry.

As we turn to scripture, we can read in Jeremiah 29:11-12, "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope. <sup>12</sup> Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will hear you. <sup>13</sup> You will seek me and find me, when you seek me with all your heart."

God has a plan and a purpose for His people as individuals and for this church as we bond together as a worshipping community. Here are some of the first responses to the questions in the Congregational Study

What are some of the things you like best about this church? Many said the stained-glass windows and that this is a beautiful church. Many also mentioned the people, who enjoy each other, the fellowship we have, the friendliness of people. We have good people, very caring and willing to volunteer. We have had great music- choir, bell choir; singing. The Pastor was also mentioned.

What are the greatest strengths of this congregation? Some said our committees; leaders; friendships. Our people are good to volunteer for projects. Our media outreach is a major strength, especially video during Covid Our radio broadcast has been a great blessing for many years and the local cable as well as the livestreaming. The ministry of the Deacons is an important strength that helps us to connect with people. Many are naturally caring about others and are often asking about how family members are doing. We care about the community. Internet and email communications have been helpful to mobilize prayer and share news. Music is an important strength of our congregation.

The Session has been responsive to our need to make some changes in how we do things. We have received a grant from the Presbytery that has kick-started the process of upgrading the audio and visual aspects of our worship. This includes several components:

- 1) Adding speakers on each side of the sanctuary to supplement the sound from the main speaker in the ceiling. Also, adding microphones for the choir/special music; a boom mike to use with the piano, and mixing in general sound from the congregation for our broadcasts.
- 2) A new camera that will connect through a computer using a better (lower) angle than our current cable feed and incorporating the live streaming into one. This will use a worship program on comuter that will enable us to present a higher quality (visual and audio) to the cable and online community.
- 3) An additional component that will be a part of improving what we broadcast as well as adding to our worship experience in the sanctuary will be the addition of two video monitors, one on each side of the sanctuary. This will enable us to include the responsive readings, unison prayers and music on the monitors as well as add other components to enhance our worship, such as: video clips, visual illustrations and emphasis for the sermons, we will be able to have presentations from missionaries and leaders from the

larger church like the presbytery and General Assembly level.

Those are a few of the possibilities and there are many more. Last week many of the Pastor's in the Ministerial Association gathered to say farewell to Father Sharad and I took the opportunity to ask how many were using projections in their worship and I was surprised to discover that every one of them were already using them except at the Catholic Church and they are exploring how they might add it as well. Two were looking at upgrading from projection screens to monitors.

30 years ago I presented the idea to the congregation in Algona and we began using a projection screen (they have since moved on to using monitors). I was surprised to discover that the older generation appreciated it the most. Our purpose had been to be more attractive to younger families, but it was a pleasant discovery that the elder worshippers really appreciated reading from large print on screen instead of holding a hymnal,.

The Session is desiring to utilize technology that is available to congregations as the world changes around us, but also wants the members of the congregation to be aware of what we are exploring. I think that is one of the greatest strengths of our congregation. We are willing to work together and explore possibilities as we try to keep pace with trying to reach out and bring blessing to more people than we have been and fit within the rapidly shifting society around us.

I will continue sharing these responses in the August newsletter.
