Welcome to October!

This month we will be doing a lot of celebrating, World Communion Sunday, Stewardship planning for the coming year, and a combined worship celebration for Reformation Sunday the last Sunday of the month.



World Communion Sunday is always the first Sunday of October and calls the church to recognize our shared theology of being welcomed to the table by the grace of God. Even though we have differences about how God is at work in the meal, all Christian people celebrate the same truth that this is Christ's table, and it is Jesus who invites us and welcomes to this foretaste of the feast prepared for us in the heavenly kingdom.

We will gather at our two worship services and be reminded that God is at work among us, reminding us that God loves us and forgives, and in this shared meal we see the visible signs of God's grace and love in the common elements of bread and grape juice.

October also gives us a chance to explore our gratitude for all the blessings we have received from God. Stewardship is less about being asked to make a financial and personal commitment to the work of the church as it is about finding an appropriate response to the blessings God has provided us throughout our life. Our stewardship is just another way of talking about how we live our lives as disciples of the one who continues to call us into ministry together.

Finally, we will celebrate a One Service event on the fifth Sunday of October at 10:00 am, which also happens to be Reformation Sunday. On that Sunday we will gather to celebrate some of the best traditions of the Presbyterian Church.

I am looking forward to seeing you at all of these great celebrations!

# From Our Music Programs Coordinator/Director

Fall is finally upon us with all of its familiar markers-football, pumpkin -flavored everything, a cool breeze, and Advent music rehearsals? Yes! The Lessons and Carols service is one of my favorite services of the year because of all of the beautiful and diverse music we get to create, and we have to start preparing in October. On October 20th at 6:30 in the choir room we'll do an overview of all of the music we'll be performing for our Lessons and Carols service in December. The seasonal choirs are a great opportunity to test the waters and join your voice with a larger group of musicians. You also get more time to rehearse and make new friends singing Christmas songs. What more could you ask for? I suspect most of you know what Lessons and Carols is, but maybe you're not as familiar with the history of the service. The first Lessons and Carols service was held in 1880 at the Truro Cathedral in Cornwall. United Kingdom, but it is more popularly associated with King's College in Cambridge. The first occurrence of the service in King's College was held in 1928 on Christmas Eve. Eric Milner-White was an army chaplain during WWI and was concerned that people were becoming disconnected from their faith due to the chaos from the war. He decided to capitalize on King's rich choral tradition and instituted the service as a way to win people back to the church. He was immensely successful in popularizing the format, and the service has been performed every year since. His version of Lessons and Carols didn't differ much from the original service held in 1880, but it was Milner-White who set the tradition of opening the service with "Once in Royal David's City."

Now nearly a century later we still enjoy this rich tradition, and I invite you to participate first hand this season with the choir (or if you've been itching to put your guitar or piano skills to the test the 9 a.m. service would love to have you too)! All levels of experience are welcome, and I know if you ask anyone that has participated before they'll tell you how much they've enjoyed the experience. There's also a great sense of accomplishment in putting in the work for several weeks and finally hearing the story of the birth of Christ come to life through worship and song during the Lessons and Carols service. I look forward to worshipping with you all soon!

We're back! We have moved back into the building for worship, fellowship, and work. We are also moving into a new season, which affords us the opportunity to look ahead and to envision all that we are being called to do as stewards of God's blessings at Trinity Presbyterian Church.

Team Stewardship asks that you prayerfully decide "in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." The work of Trinity relies on each us responding to God's instructions to bless others as we have been blessed by Him. In this manner, each of the church's ministries will "abound in every good work," as we give in accordance with what we have been given, knowing that all our needs have been supplied.

Included in your packet with your pledge cards will be a pre-addressed, stamped envelope for you to use to return your cards to the church. If you prefer, you can bring your cards to Commitment Sunday, November 14th. We will use that time to dedicate all the pledges to God's work through Trinity Presbyterian Church.

**Opening Prayer:** The meeting was opened with prayer by Chris Jones.

Declaration of Quorum: A quorum was present.

**Housekeeping Details**: Chris Jones and the Session discussed status/updates of members who were sick, in the hospital, recovering, and/or grieving.

**Membership Update**: As of September 9, 2021, the Church has 441 members, of which 424 are resident and 8 are non-resident.

New members Angie and Danny Helmly, Rhonda and Joel Smithwick, and Nancy Nadolny were welcomed into the life of the church. Motion was made and seconded to accept them into membership.

**Clerk Report**: The minutes of the Stated Session Meeting on August 12, 2021, were reviewed. A motion was made to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded, and the motion passed by acclimation.

#### Communications:

**Old Business**: Pastor Nominating Progress – Chris gave update on PNC. Mary Pace moderator, Letitia Verdin recording secretary.

New Business: Vote to change date of session meetings, unanimously approved.

Congregational Meeting to form a nominating committee. Julie Rogers will chair the committee. Will nominate at large member 9/26 between worship services at 10:50. Chris outlined the new team report template and process for submitting to clerk.

#### **Standing Team Reports**

**Christianity and Spiritual Development:** Julie Rogers reported that volunteers are needed. The plan is to hire a nursery attendant. A wonderful letter from outside the church was received from a parent with Kudos to Terri and crew for VBS. The Tag Sale raised \$4600 plus \$1700 from the November sale. Rally Day-continental breakfast, intro to classes/teachers in gym and then go to classes.

**Evangelism:** Leslie Weikle and Liz Crosland reported that the Welcome Desk in the narthex is back in working order. Volunteer slips are available. Recruiting volunteers to man the desk.

# Session Highlights (Cont.)

The team continues to send postcards each quarter to new residents. 120 were sent last quarter. Four families visited and filled out a card since we started welcome table outside.

At the Travelers Restival – 50 people filled out info cards - 25 of which left email address

Liz explained display of proposed signage examples. Larry Moore is checking into possibility of Greenville Tech masonry department building the base of a sign which would save a great deal of money.

Long-range Planning: Team report template was outlined by Rev. Jones.

**Stewardship:** Leslie Weikle gave a brief report. Time and talent survey went out to the congregation via email. Good response so far. Sunday, October 3 – session barbeque for stewardship kickoff.

**Fellowship:** Gordon Taylor reported that there will be a Continental Breakfast for Rally Day. WNL starts next week and Shortfield's will be catering and delivering again. Fellowship team will set up and clean up. Recruiting more volunteers.

#### Humanitarian Witness: No report

**Missions/Outreach and Oversite:** Brad Pochard reported that a new tent was purchased and used at the Travelers Restival. Great turnout from Trinity!

**Property and Grounds:** Larry Moore gave the report. On September 14, they will be punching a hole in back wall of downstairs to try to solve water issue. On September 25, vendors will park in our lot for the Indie Craft Parade at Trailblazer Park.

**Worship and Music:** Lisa Barksdale reported that greeters will be outside the sanctuary for first Sunday back in the building. Ushers will be accommodating for needs and counting and taking offering. Sign for "masks inside recommended" will be placed outside the doors to the gym and sanctuary. Lucy Hammack forming separate committee for greening of the church.

Communion will continue to be by intinction.

Congregation/Care: Cherry reports that all systems are working well.

Finance: Before the Finance team report, Jeff Wingard gave the monthly budget report.

#### Personnel & Administration – No report

**Monthly Budget Report**: Jeff Wingard presented the monthly budget reports. He reported that for the month of July there was a \$2526 surplus. Through August 2021, total actual operating expenses were approximately 62.03% of the annual budget.
