SAAFE House is celebrating its 35th Anniversary and asking people to consider \$35 donations – "\$35 for 35." In these times of COVID isolation concerns over domestic violence are rising. SAFFE House operates in Walker, Trinity and San Jacinto counties. It is fully engaged in helping build stronger families in our community. In the last annual report, it served a total of 395 women and children in outreach services and 171 clients resided in shelters. Clients in shelters average about 35 nights of stay, and collectively amount to ,887 shelter nights, but stays can actually be only one day or a number of months. In serving 395 outreach clients staff logged about ,792 days of client service.

Greetings. These certainly have been strange and challenging months since COVID showed up on our doorstep, and closed our door physically. We all have been adjusting to a sense of isolation and "apartness" but at the same time, we all have been what we can to retain a sense of community.

At Thoreau Woods that has meant doing services by ZOOM. While we have had respectable participation, we know it's not ideal. We all have different levels of technology comfort and it's been a learning and growing experience not just for those attending but those of us who have had our share of "oops" moments as service leaders and presenters. We also know not everyone has technology and so we are saddened that we have lost touch with some friends and members.

The Board would like to announce that Rev. Vicki is returning as our part-time minister. The Board has been meeting with her and discussing what her "scope of duties" will be. But, topping the list is drawing on her experience and compassion to help us reach out to all our members and friends who may be feeling alone, suffering from physical and spiritual malaise. As always, we want you to let us know what Vicki, and all of us, can do to help you.

Some have asked when we will "be back." At our July meeting it was the consensus of the Board that the best answer is "we don't know." It all depends on not just our ability to follow guidelines but the rates of injection and the comfort level of each member and friend. For now we are saying January but monitoring the situation.

Stewardship

Even though the church is not meeting, there are still expenses. The Board is managing finances as closely as possible and as of the end of July the church is solvent with money in the bank. JOIN OUR PRISON MINISTRY

The degree of civilization in a society can be judged by entering its prisons.

The Unitarian Universalist First Principle affirms the inherent worth and dignity of every person. Yet every day millions of incarcerated people are told the exact opposite of this principle, that they are worthless and undeserving. Through prison visits and letter writing, we at TWUUC have a special opportunity to show incarcerated people living right here in Huntsville that they are inherently worthy of love and justice.

We need you to help nurture our nascent prison ministry. Working together we can show incarcerated people that they are not forgotten and that those of us in the "free world" care about their well-being. Our program consists of one-on-one visits, letter writing and phone calls with local inmates at the Ellis Unit located on FM 980 in Huntsville.

This ministry is organized and led by Vicki DellaSperanza Hernandez and her husband Martin Hernandez who is incarcerated at Ellis Unit. Vicki organizes and trains volunteers in the so-called free world, and Martin leads the program from inside the prison. Together they launched a letter-writing campaign that connects pen-pals who write monthly. Their vision is to establish one-on-one (non-contact) visits with men, who over the years, have had either very few visits or none at all. Whether you are interested in writing or visiting, you will receive guidance and assistance every step of the way. Vicki and Martin are committed to ensuring a safe, secure and mutually beneficial experience for both volunteers and inmates.
